Families please note - given the changes in our community's response to the improving pandemic conditions, Troop 23 is making the following changes to our in-person meeting protocols:

HEALTH FORMS UPDATE:

- All Continuing Scouts those going to Summer Camp AND those NOT going to Summer Camp should turn in new health forms (Parts A and B with a copy of your current health insurance card). They expire after 1 year and our goal is to have all our Scouts on roughly the same schedule with providing new health forms in the Spring.
- Additional Form For Scouts Going To Summer Camp Scouts going to Summer Camp must also have a current Part C filled out and signed by the Scout's physician on file; <u>but not all Scouts</u> <u>need a new one</u>. Because of our July timing of Summer Camp last year and Part Cs being valid until the last day of the month they're dated, many Scouts will not need a new part C for Summer Camp this year.
