Wreath Sales

The primary fundraiser for Troop 23 is selling Christmas wreaths and holiday greenery. All Scouts are expected to participate in the wreath fundraiser and encouraged to set sales goals to fund their camping trips, summer camp, and other scouting experiences.

Since 2019, Troop 23 has been including a Fallen Hero wreath option as part of our wreath program. This created a new tradition for the Scouts to place greens purchased through this offering on the graves of veterans buried at Wheaton Cemetery in a ceremony held each year in early December.

EAGLE SCOUTS

Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouts of America. To become an Eagle Scout, eligible Scouts must complete an Eagle Project. In its history, Troop 23 has helped hundreds of young men earn the rank of Eagle Scout. We are very proud such a high percentage of our older Scouts attain the rank of Eagle Scout. Recent Eagle Projects have included:

- Clean and repair/re-set gravestones at St. Charles Cemetery
- Design and build a podium for use at school wrestling meets
- Design and build picnic tables at school
- Organize a diaper and baby supply drive
- Plan and execute a neighborhood seed repository at local library
- Creating a Dog Sensory Garden at the Naperville Humane Society
- Constructing a bridge at Happy Hooves Therapeutic Farm
- Building a weather station at Longfellow Elementary School

HIGH ADVENTURE

Troop 23 strives to offer older Scouts a challenging High Adventure Experience each year. These are longer 10- to 14-day camping trips that are physically and mentally challenging, packed with fun and activities. Recent High Adventure trips include: Philmont Scout Ranch in New Mexico, Boundary Waters canoeing in Minnesota, and Scouting's Sea Base in Florida.
