Service Projects

In 2020, the need for social distancing required Troop 23 to shift its many traditionally troop-wide service activities to individual Scout opportunities. Some of these included:

- Virtual Crop Walk—raised awareness and funds to fight hunger
- Midwest Shelter for Homeless Veterans prepared meals for residents
- DuPage County Forest Preserves and the Elmhurst Great Western Prairie—removed trash and invasive species
- Additional hours spent at Feed My Starving Children; Wheaton Garden Club's community plant sale; local churches; and more.

In Fall 2021, the Troop resumed its monthly service project efforts which include service and conservation activities.

Wreath Sales

The primary fundraiser for Troop 23 is selling Christmas wreaths and holiday greenery. All Scouts are expected to participate in the wreath fundraiser and encouraged to set sales goals to fund their camping trips, summer camp, and other scouting experiences.

Since 2019, Troop 23 has been including a Fallen Hero wreath option in our community. This created a new tradition for the Scouts to place greens purchased through this offering on the graves of veterans buried at Wheaton Cemetery in a ceremony held each year on or near December 7.

Scout Sunday

Each year, in early February, Troop 23 celebrates Scout Sunday by participating in worship services at First Presbyterian Church and by serving donuts to its congregation.

In 2021, Scouts participated in the church's virtual service and coordinated a drive-thru event where church members received pre-packaged donuts from the Scouts as well as collection bags for a church-sponsored food drive.

EAGLE SCOUTS

Eagle Scout is the highest rank attainable in the Boy Scouts of America. To achieve the rank of Eagle, eligible Scouts must complete an Eagle Project.

In its history, Troop 23 has 236 Eagle Scouts. Currently, 10 Scouts in Troop 23 have earned their Life Rank and are on track to complete their Eagle requirements. Several of those are currently working on their projects.

Current Eagle Projects underway:

- Constructing a bridge at Happy Hooves Therapeutic Farm
- Creating a pop tab collection bin at the Ronald McDonald House

Other recent Eagle Projects include:

- Building a weather station at Longfellow Elementary School
- Coordinating a pet supply drive for Starfish Animal Rescue
- Making masks for Wyndemere Senior Care nursing home and Midwest Shelter for Homeless Veterans.
- Collecting new baby supplies for the Evangelical Child and Family Agency
- Creating shelving units for St. Michael Catholic Church
- Landscaping at Tammy's Trace, a home for female veterans
- Soundproofing a music recording studio at Monroe Middle School
